Group: Tuesday Morning Prayer Group Where: Joan Kingham Chapel When: Every Tuesday morning 9.30 - 10.00am The group gathers in the Joan Kingham Chapel each Tuesday morning for an opportunity to come quietly before God and lift to Him prayers for that week for the individual, the church, the community and the world. The group follows a set pattern of morning worship including a psalm and a reading taken from the URC Prayer Handbook. There is an opportunity at the beginning to share concerns or give thanks to help inform people's prayers which are then spoken silently and out loud. Simon, our minister, generally leads the session, but not always and the group still meets when he is unavailable. There is no expectation of regular attendance or to speak. Some people go most weeks, others just occasionally. Some people regularly pray out loud, others prefer to remain silent. Anyone is welcome to attend any week. Coffee or tea is available afterwards. Regular attendee Gill Watts said:

"I love to go because we can learn who needs our prayers that week. We can leave those prayers and issues on our hearts with the Lord, place them in His hands."
