Use your LOAF!

Food plays a central part in our life, it also contributes to the impact we have on the earth and on other people. The decisions we make about our food have far-

reaching effects for example transporting one kilo of apples from New Zealand adds one kilo of carbon dioxide emissions to the atmosphere. Fruit from local trees emits none.

When thinking about food, the acronym LOAF can be useful to help assess how ethical yours is:

- L local,
- O organic,
- A Animal friendly and
- F fairly traded.

Group: Tab Eco Group When: Every 2 months

With members aged 16 to 65 and a remit from Traidcraft to toilets, the eco-group is possibly the Tab's most diverse group. It is a new group, established in 2018, to ensure we protect God's creation and its people as much as possible. With the threat of catastrophic climate change and global inequality growing ever more urgent, we aim to be - and encourage others to be - responsible stewards.

Our initial focus has been on enrolling the Tab into A Rocha's Christian environmental scheme, Eco Church, and we have already gained bronze status and are now aiming for silver. We will have green energy across the whole premises by the end of the year, have taken steps to improve energy efficiency in the church building, started weekly eco-tips in our communications, are investigating the use of eco-friendly products in the Tab, started schemes to encourage wildlife in the Tab grounds, are starting a group to lobby decision-makers on ecological and global justice issues, are developing ideas to extend the Traidcraft stall to include a refill service for detergents and are planning 'green' worship and study sessions to name just a few of our activities.

So if you love bees and butterflies, want to use less plastic, feel passionate about Fairtrade, want to lower your carbon footprint or call for action to prevent further suffering of communities impacted by climate change, then come and join us! We meet every couple of months and there's room for people with a whole range of different interests. As partners in God's creative and renewing activity we believe the church has a key role to play in bringing about change towards a more just world.
